






# **New orchard for Thornbury Park**

Trees for Cities is working in partnership with the London Borough of Hounslow to plant 23 fruit and nut trees at Thornbury Park. This will create a beautiful orchard to support a rich habitat for wildlife and produce a free, delicious harvest.

Following consultation with Cllr Louki, secretary of the Friends of Thornbury Park, and the council's parks team, a location for the orchard has been identified either side of the path as shown on the map below. The trees will be planted so fruit will not fall on the path but there will still be a lovely avenue of trees to walk through. There will be soft spring blossom, summer fruit and colourful autumn leaves!
